Induction in the Residency Program

To regularize and implement the system of national Residency Program, some points that affect the process of admissions for FCPS-II training with effect from January, 2010 session are presented below:

1. FCPS-Part-II (IMM) admissions are done in the following subjects:
 - a. Anaesthesia
 - b. Dental specialities
 - c. Diagnostic Radiology
 - d. Family Medicine
 - e. Medicine & Allied
 - f. Obstetrics & Gynaecology
 - g. Ophthalmology
 - h. Otorhino-laryngology (ENT)
 - i. Paediatrics
 - j. Pathology specialities
 - k. Psychiatry
 - l. Surgery & Allied
 - m. Community Medicine
 - n. Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation
2. Each unit of the above mentioned subjects with a sanctioned strength of **THREE** or more CPSP approved supervisors will induct up to **FOUR** Post Graduate Residents (Trainees) in January session and then another **FOUR** in July session.
3. This induction will be over and above the existing trainees in a unit. This concession is being granted till such time as the national residency programme becomes systematic.
4. Those subjects which do not require an in-patient (including Anaesthesia, Diagnostic Radiology, Community Medicine, Forensic Medicine, Pathology specialties, etc.) will induct **SIX** Post Graduate Residents (Trainees) in January session and **SIX** in July session.
5. Units of General Surgery and General Medicine may admit **FOUR** additional Post Graduate Resident (Trainees) in January session and **FOUR** Post Graduate Resident (Trainees) in July session against the specialties.
6. These **EIGHT** Post Graduate Residents (Trainees) inducted against specialties in General Surgery & General Medicine units must move to specialty of their choice after completion of two years training and other requirements of the Intermediate Module Examination. Such residents will not be allowed to continue 3rd/4th year training in Medicine/Surgery by changing their specialty.
7. Those students who move to specialties, will continue their specialty training but would not be eligible for FCPS-II examination until they have cleared their IMM examination and completed all other requirements.

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
