**PRACTICAL - MAXIMUM MARKS: 40**

Spotting of structures (in slides seen under the microscope or projected on the screen or with the naked eye).

- Histology
- Embryology

**ORAL - MAXIMUM MARKS: 60**

The practical and oral component (component A-2) will be rated by average of all the four examiners.

**VIVA VOCE (60 MARKS)**

The viva examination will last for 60 minutes and will be conducted at two stations by a pair of examiners (30 minutes at each stations). This part of the examination will assess the candidates's ability of the knowledge of Histology, Embryology, Neuroanatomy and clinical anatomy.

**THESIS DEFENSE (100 marks.....60 minutes)**

This component will last for 60 minutes and will be conducted at one station by a panel of four examiners. This part of examination will be pertinent to the contents of Thesis.

**THESIS EVALUATION (100 marks)**

This thesis is sent prior to the clinical examination by four assessors.
